**Article 2: Zoning Ordinance Amendment #1**

Are you in favor of the amendment to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board to change Sections 8.1.1 and 8.1.2 to be consistent with the change approved in 2008 which altered Table 6.9 eliminating multi-family dwellings in the Suburban Residential 1 (SR1), Suburban Residential 2 (SR2), and the Country Residential (CR) Districts? This proposed amendment will correct the inconsistency in the Zoning Ordinance.

## ARTICLES CONTINUED

### Article 4: Resolution for Fair Redistricting (by petition)

To see if the Town of Rollinsford will urge the New Hampshire General Court, which is obligated to redraw the maps of political districts within the state following the 2020 census, to ensure fair and effective representation of New Hampshire residents by drawing the new district maps without relying on partisan data favoring particular parties or candidates and that all meetings, hearings and deliberations regarding redistricting shall be open to the public.

The record of the vote approving this article shall be transmitted by written notice from the Rollinsford Select Board to the state legislators representing the Town of Rollinsford and to the Governor of the State of New Hampshire informing them of the instructions from their constituents within thirty (30) days of the vote.

### Article 5: Operating Budget

Shall the Town of Rollinsford raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$2,464,122? Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$2,441,266, which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Rollinsford or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.
